

A View from the Vicarage

Over Christmas we had a conjunction in the night sky, as Jupiter and Saturn came into alignment for the first time in twenty years. It was visible for a few days during December - something for astronomers to train their telescopes on during these cold winter nights.

The season of Epiphany reminds us of Magi who were devoted students of the stars 2000 years ago. These Magi were men from the East rather than Jews, and



probably educated laymen rather than royalty. One day these 'wise men' saw something in the heavens that truly caught their attention - possibly a conjunction like the one we've just seen ourselves. Pause for Thought by Alan Dowen


Cruel winter cuts through like the reaper,
