A View from the Vicarage

All of us have watched the news with horror over recent weeks, following the Russian army's invasion of Ukraine. Countless innocent lives have been lost, and the destruction inflicted upon the towns and cities of Ukraine has been immense. Millions have fled the country, creating a twenty-first century refugee crisis in the very heart of Europe. Many brave Ukrainian men and women have responded to the Russian invasion by taking up arms to defend their land and their loved ones. They have left



their ordinary civilian lives behind and enlisted in their nation's territorial defence forces. An unknown number have already made the ultimate sacrifice on the battlefield.

The Archbishop of Canterbury has described the invasion of Ukraine as "an act of great evil" and called on members of the Church of England to pray for "an urgent ceasefire and the withdrawal of Russian forces". Christian Aid have also set up a Ukraine Humanitarian Crisis Appeal, which can be supported financially via their website: www.christianaid.org.uk

So many of the events of recent weeks resonate with the events of the first Easter two thousand years ago. An innocent man, Jesus of Nazareth, lost his life at the hands of evil men – killed by soldiers from Rome, rather than Russia. The Bible explains that Christ willingly made the ultimate sacrifice for the world he loved, so that every man, woman and child could be given the chance to enjoy peace and reconciliation with God. Nor did Jesus stay dead. His resurrection on the first Easter Sunday was a great victory over the grave, a conquest over all the forces of evil in this fallen world.

Watching the news at the moment can be a depressing experience. But the message of Easter is that death and evil do not have the last word. Christ has risen, Christ has conquered, and we look forward to the day when he has promised to make all things new.



Pause for Thought by Alan Dowen



He is not here; he has risen!

Matthew 28:6

That short phrase is central to the Christian message of hope. Just a couple of days before it was uttered, Jesus had endured the most terrible and painful of all deaths but on that first Easter Sunday, when Mary Magdalene and 'the other Mary' went to look at the tomb, they discovered that his body was no longer there and an angel told them that he had risen: death itself had been defeated. The story continues by telling us that the women were overjoyed and rushed off to tell the disciples the Good News.

The resurrection represents the greatest revelation of God's plan of salvation in history, and yet it remains true that no one actually saw the body of Jesus Christ coming to life in the silence of the tomb. His death and ascension were both public spectacles which many people witnessed, but the moment of the resurrection was essentially private and hidden; there was no public display of life entering into the dead body of Jesus.

So, why did he not rise in the presence of a crowd and put all doubt to flight? Well, we operate every day in our courts with the principle that truth may be established on the testimony of eyewitnesses and here that testimony is important. Some say that that a secret resurrection now places us all on the same level: no one is put at any advantage. All of us must take this doctrine on the basis of faith. The women had to trust the angels; the disciples had to trust the women; and now, we must trust the witness of the disciples.

Easter is a truly joyous occasion, a time for celebration after a period of darkness and so we respond, "He is risen indeed, Alleluia!"
