



Pause for Thought by Alan Dowen

Caesar Augustus issued a decree that a census should be taken of the entire Roman world. So Joseph also went up from the town of Nazareth in Galilee



to Judea, to Bethlehem the town of David, because he belonged to the house and line of David. He went there to register with Mary, who was pledged to be married to him and was expecting a child.

Luke 2:1, 4 & 5

The words of the Christmas Carol, "How far is it to Bethlehem?" were adapted from a poem written by Frances Chesterton, the wife of G K Chesterton, back in 1917. In the carol, the response to that first line is, "Not very far." but I can almost hear Mary sighing, "I wish!" In reality, the journey from Nazareth to Bethlehem was about 90 miles: for a man leading a donkey with a pregnant woman on its back, that journey would have taken about 4 days — slightly longer than the 20, uncomfortable minutes it took me to drive to the Countess Hospital with my wife when my own daughters were born — but that is not the real issue here. Frances wasn't asking how far away Bethlehem is from our houses, rather, she was trying to address our hesitancy in approaching Jesus. We seem unsure about whether we are worthy, or have permission to enter into his presence. We want to see Him, but we are shy about opening the door of the stable. Perhaps if we go in and just stand by the animals, lingering at the edges of the scene, we will be close enough, and yet, we still have more of the journey to make. As we gather up enough courage to approach Jesus, lying there in the manger, God, made man, sleeping peacefully and undisturbed, how far have we travelled to arrive at this holy place? How many miles have our hearts walked, or suffered on the back of a donkey, searching for the feeling of peace and comfort which only he can provide? So ask yourself, is it possible that what you seek can be found nestled in a cradle made of wood and straw? And, how far is your heart from Bethlehem?
