View from the Vicarage

Life doesn't always go according to plan, does it? Our ambitions, hopes and dreams don't always materialise. Our future plans can be thrown up in the air by unforeseen events.

For example, you may have seen in the news that the 2023 World Scout Jamboree in South Korea didn't quite go as anticipated. 45,000 Scouts from around the world (including my son James) arrived at the Jamboree on 1st August expecting a fun fortnight of camping and outdoor activities. Unfortunately, they



instead encountered searing heat, high humidity, poor sanitation, meagre rations and mosquito bites. To top it all, the campsite lay in the path of a powerful typhoon that threatened to swamp it with torrential rain and storm force winds!

So, after just a few days, the site had to be evacuated and all Scouts relocated to safer accommodation in the capital, Seoul. But adversity is the mother of invention, and thanks to the efforts of the South Korean government and the Scouting authorities a whole new programme of sight-seeing, concerts and other activities were hastily arranged for the forty thousand affected Scouts. A potentially disastrous and hugely disappointing situation was rescued and redeemed. All the affected Scouts have now safely returned home, with happy memories that will last a lifetime.

The Bible describes another victory drawn from the jaws of defeat. Human history got off to a terrible start when our first ancestors rebelled against their Creator and brought evil into our world. A rebellion perpetuated in countless sinful acts over subsequent centuries. But thankfully God intervened to rescue us and remedy the situation, via the life, death and resurrection of Jesus Christ. Through faith in him, God has made it possible for us to be forgiven our past, to be given new purpose in the present, and to become heirs of eternal life in the future. Whatever life throws at us, we are never beyond the reach of God's grace.

Pause for Thought

Always be yourself, have faith and do not go out looking for a successful personality to duplicate

I have been thinking about how difficult it is to coherently express fundamental Christian concepts — God, Prayer, Sin when speaking to friends, strangers, relatives and acquaintances, especially now, in the 21st Century, when the Sacred-Secular divide seems to be ever widening. Interactions and attention spans are becoming increasingly short or fragmented in ways which seem designed to distract from the nuances of faith and this may be particularly true when one's own thoughts and beliefs are not fully formed or aligned with the 'traditional' views of the Church.

I look with admiration at some of the great orators of our time, including our own Bishop Mark of Chester, but I know in my heart that I will never be able to I can only do what I can do. So I have concluded that honesty is the best policy: all I have is me and I just have to trust that God will assist when words become difficult to find. Added to that, I have realised that it is okay to have personal doubts and fears, but there are also moments when I feel that I have stumbled upon certainty; times when my thoughts seem so much easier to express; times when God feels very close and I am able to appreciate his glory, not the same as observing something beautiful perhaps --it is something closer to a feeling of ecstasy and more about insight than physical sight.

I am still very much in learning mode and I know that I don't have all of the answers: there will always be some answers which we will need to seek out together. Are you willing to join me on that journey?
