
Congratulations

View from the Vicarage

The Season of Creation (1st September to 4th October) may not be as well-known as the seasons of Advent, Christmas, or Easter, but its that time of the year when Christians around the world unite to thank God for the beauty and fruitfulness of his creation. It is also the season when Christians and churches of all denominations pledge to take better care of our common home - Planet Earth.

A mighty river is the symbol chosen for the Season of Creation 2023, and is inspired by the Old Testament prophet Amos's cry: "Let justice roll on like a river, righteousness like a never-failing stream!" (Amos 5: 24). These words challenge us to live lives of greater

What is this life if, full of care, we have no time to stand and stare.

Just two lines taken from the well known poem, 'Leisure', by William Henry Davies. I suppose it's a question which has been posed for all of us, but how often do we stop to stare and take in the beauty and grandeur of the world around us?

I have recently returned from a late summer holiday with my wife and we were based in Mortehoe, North Devon. It's a place with a rugged coastline which is both awesome and dangerous in almost equal measure. It's a place which invites the traveller to stand (or sit) and stare and it rewards patience.

Here, as elsewhere, the shear power of the sea has shaped the landscape: there are beaches, cliffs and jagged inlets at almost every turn. But whilst the sea has the ability to take life (there have been numerous shipwrecks along this coast) it also has an incredible ability to support life too ... including ours!
