### View from the Vicarage

Have you ever signed up to a social media account, like Facebook, Twitter or Nextdoor? If so, you'll know that you're often asked to create a "personal profile" to appear alongside your photo. This profile is supposed to include a few lines that summarise your personality, career, relationships, hobbies and interests.

During our Sunday services this December we'll be spending time looking at the opening chapter of John's Gospel - known as his 'prologue'.

A prologue that describes the personal profile of the greatest man who has ever lived. Not simply someone you would

want to befriend on Facebook or follow on Twitter, but someone to entrust with your entire life.

In a few weeks' time we'll be starting 2024 and celebrating another New Year. But the character we're introduced to in John's prologue had no beginning. Because John tells us that "In the beginning was the Word". Before the cosmos was created, even before time itself - there was the Word of God. Astonishingly, John uses a personal pronoun to describe this Word – he's a "he" not an "it"! John wants us to know that God's "Word" is not a force, a phrase or a sound effect but a fully-fledged person. John goes further to tell us that this person was in a relationship "with" God. At the heart of the universe is a relationship comparable to the love between a human father and son. Indeed, God's Son is the Father's 'selfie' – a picture-perfect likeness in every way.

And the great news we celebrate every Christmas is that God's Word "became flesh and dwelt among us". It remains mind-blowing to think that the Son of God was born a baby at Bethlehem. It remains the greatest miracle that the Creator of the Cosmos walked on earth as Jesus Christ. And why did Christ come? He was born to offer eternal life and ethical clarity to every citizen of Planet Earth. Wonderfully, he also came to offer us God's full forgiveness for every wrong thing we've ever done – for all those things we'd be far too ashamed to put on our social media profile! So thank God – and Merry Christmas!

A time for the whole family to rediscover the real meaning of Christmas.


### 25th December - 10.00am All-Age Christmas Communion

I miss the simplicity of the Christmases of my youth. On Christmas Eve, to escape the cold, we would huddle around the coal fire in the lounge (the only room in the whole house which was heated) either watching Christmas programmes on our 9"(!), black and white television screen or listening to carols on the 'wireless'. Often the room would only be lit by candles and the Christmas tree, which looked as though it was made from a collection of green bottle brushes, twinkling with its glass baubles and string of 12 lights (operating at 240 volts! — Health and Safety had yet to be invented).

By lunchtime that day, the shops had closed and they would remain closed until after Boxing Day — the Christmas Season was far less commercialised and it left space for the Christmas message to be heard loud and clear.

We children would have sent our 'simple' Christmas lists 'up the chimney' and there was a great sense of expectation, not only that Santa was on his way but that, that night, a Saviour would be born, in a stable, in Bethlehem — we all knew the story because in those days we were taught about it at school.

As I now look back as an adult, I notice that there seems to have more to do, more to buy, more to spend — but less time to think about the birth of Jesus and I want to be more like the child that I once was, filled with that sense of awe and wonder that made Christmas so special. So I wish you all a happy and joyous Christmas with space to 'ponder these things in your hearts'.


