A View Through My Study Window

The vicar is away on Sabbatical but things here in Ashton Hayes and Mouldsworth are progressing more or less as normal. Well there has been quite a bit of it around Ashton in recent times. The changes we made to the interior of the church seem ancient history compared to the



change that will come about with the refurbishment of the community's newly acquired pub — yes, we are all looking forward to the Golden Lion reopening.

But by the time you read this there will probably have been another significant change in all our lives - that of our elected government: as I write the polls are firmly suggesting it will be Labour in charge, but the people's vote may turn out to be completely different - who knows? We know that he will guide us, offer us protection and rescue us when we are in trouble; he will be with us constantly; he will listen to our concerns, help us to bear our difficulties and be applied fairly, so, let's keep the faith.

Pause for Thought

''I know your troubles; Í know that you are poor but really you are rich!

Revelation 2:9

It's a wonderful thing when a child tells you their first joke. They may have learned it at school but it is clear that they have been practising it over and over again in their heads until they get home and can tell everyone else in the family and they laugh every time they tell it. Their family laugh too ... even if it is one they have heard before. The fact that they already know the story doesn't stop them listening intently and receiving it as if it were for the first time - it's all about the relationship.

When we pray, whether for ourselves, our friends or the huge issues of the nations hunger, war, climate change, or poverty - we are not telling God something that he doesn't already know. We cannot surprise him with our concerns, but he loves our relationship, and in the conversation, and the silence, we begin to find our minds, hearts and wills becoming more aligned to his love and his plan.

It was like that for the early church in Smyrna. They lived in beautiful city, but its beauty was a backdrop for idol-worship and persecution of Christians. The idols today may take different forms - political ideas, what celebrities think, peer-group pressure - but the persecution of people of faith is more prevalent today than at any time in history.

So when we share our difficulties with God and feel impoverished, we are also sharing our pressures, failures and fears with our brothers and sisters down the centuries and across the world and in doing so we find that, in the midst of despair, he reminds us of our riches.

Ultimate power is not wielded by armies or politicians; it rests with our loving heavenly Father who never forgets us for a second. He is the Father who knows everything there is to know about us. It was true for Christians in Smyrna two thousand years ago and it is true for us now.

So let us remember that God understands what we have been through and he is listening intently - he hears our prayers, and he answers them all with a 'yes', 'no', or perhaps 'wait'!

When we tell him of our doubts and how aware we are of our own sin, he reminds us that Jesus is the way, the truth and the life, and that his forgiveness is free and full, and when we tell him how powerless we feel, he reminds us of the dynamic power of his Holy Spirit.
