Pause for Thought

"Since we are surrounded by such a great cloud of witnesses, let us throw off everything that hinders and the sin that so easily entangles."

Hebrews 12:1a

Did you know that a chaplain in the Royal Navy assumes the rank of the person they are talking to? So, one minute they could be a Junior Midshipman and the next they become a Rear Admiral!

I love that, and I'm pretty sure Jesus, our ultimate servant leader, would too. But, if you've ever led anything - from a coffee morning to a multi-million pound project you'll know how difficult real equality is to achieve! We tend to crave recognition and praise. Many of us want to be in control, and yet, as Christians, we all need to accept our coworkers and those whom we meet as the precious equals which they are in the sight of God. Think about it — that puts the homeless person you may meet on the street, on the same level as the person who make the tea in church or the Lord Mayor of Chester. Yet it is so easy to get caught up with feelings of superiority and our own self-importance whilst, conversely, it seems so difficult to assume the role of the humble and obedient servant in the same way that Jesus did.

However, Paul reminds us that we are surrounded and supported by a cloud of witnesses, many of whom may have gone before us - parents, teachers, guides, friends: people who have done their very best to pass the important elements of the Christian faith on to us — and he urges us to take note and reject all of the other things which may get in the way. Pride, greed, anger and envy are just four of the sins recorded as being 'deadly' in a very old list which has developed over time - parts of which may even have come from the monastic tradition. These are the failings which hinder and entangle, and need to be thrown off ... but each of these imperfections come into play all too often when we interact with others. It is only when we assume the 'rank' of the person we are talking to, whilst discarding any feeling of superiority (or inferiority), that we can really connect with others and begin to make a difference.

It is an important lesson for us all but, if we want to follow Christ, one that we must learn to live by in our daily lives.




