## Pause for Thought

"Since we are surrounded by such a great cloud of witnesses, let us throw off everything that hinders and the sin that so easily entangles."

Hebrews 12:1a

We have just been celebrating the 175th Anniversary of the church here in Ashton Hayes and, during the research into the building's history, it became clear that, over the years, approximately 1500 people have been buried in our church yard. Some of these you will have known as friends or close family members, but there are many whom we shall never know, even so, they are an inseparable part of the history of our community. One example being the Johnson family members who are buried in a vault outside, just beneath the east window. They were responsible for many of the fixtures and fittings which are still visible in our church today.

On All Saints' Day (1st November) the church has historically acknowledged all of the saints and martyrs who have not been recognised elsewhere in the Christian calendar — those who comprise the 'great cloud of witnesses' around us including the nameless and forgotten. We are recipients of a legacy of faith: a long tradition, shaped by countless people we don't even know.

Although it's important to acknowledge the ancestors of our faith, our modern-day commemorations of All Saints' Day tend to focus more on those who have lived during our lifetime and have personally impacted our lives. For many people, it's a time for remembering, and giving thanks for, the recently deceased and recognising the impact they have had on us as mentors, teachers and examples of faith in action.

Looking back at my own faith journey, starting with its tentative steps when I was just five years old, I have come to realise that each time there has been a twist or turn in the road, there was always someone there to act as my guide and point me in the right direction. My parents, my teachers, my spouse and my friends ... even the occasional vicar!

It saddens me to think that the youth of today will not have the same opportunities to explore and express their own, in-built, spirituality ... unless we share ours with them in a matter of fact sort of way which makes sense in our modern world
