View from the Vicarage

Valentines Day takes place this month, that annual celebration of romantic love. According to a recent survey, two-thirds of us celebrate the occasion and over £1.5 billion was spent in the UK last year on cards, chocolates, flowers and other Valentines gifts for our loved ones.

But what is true love? In 1 Corinthians chapter 13 the Bible provides us with a famous definition of



love. Loving qualities that we should always aspire to, not just on Valentines Day! The apostle Paul writes: "Love is patient, love is kind. It does not envy, it does not boast, it is not proud. It is not rude, it is not self-seeking, it is not easily angered, it keeps no record of wrongs. Love does not delight in evil but rejoices with the truth. It always protects, always trusts, always hopes, always perseveres" (1 Cor 13:4-7).

How do you and I measure up against that list? It's a probably a mixed picture, if we're honest! Sometimes we're guilty of pride rather than humility, of impatience rather than patience, of selfishness rather than generosity. In truth, there is only one person in history whose love never faltered. Because as we look at the life of Jesus, we see a man who was the perfect embodiment of the loving properties described in 1 Corinthians 13. When God's Son walked on earth he was humble, not proud. When Christ healed the sick he was supremely compassionate. And, above all, Jesus was self-sacrificial, not selfish, when he laid down his life on the cross for our salvation.

As we look to Christ's cross we see the ultimate loving gesture, for no one has shown "greater love than this, to lay down one's life for one's friends" (John 15:13). Jesus' great act of love should touch our hearts, and move us to love and trust him in return.

Pause for Thought

"Blessed are you who are poor, for yours is the kingdom of God. Blessed are you who are hungry now, for you will be filled." Luke 6:20-21

As I write, we have peace in Gaza although it all feels very unstable and there are threats that hostilities may recommence in sixweeks time - not a particularly good way to foster trust. But, for now, that fragile peace seems to be holding and the highest priority, other than the return of Israeli hostages and Palestinian prisoners, would appear to be the provision of food and humanitarian aid for the people of Gaza.

The food trucks are now flowing again and are hopefully managing to reach those in need — previously, the few trucks managing to cross the boarder were being violently looted and their contents were being diverted on to a black market. But food is such a fundamental requirement for life, that people actively seek it out and are willing to fight their way through a crowd to get it.

Luke records that Jesus said, 'those who are hungry are blessed and will be fed until they are full', but he wasn't referring to physical hunger, instead, he was suggesting that their 'spiritual hunger' would be satisfied. Rather like the people of Gaza's struggle to obtain physical food, we are invited to actively seek out the 'spiritual food' that is on offer, and to consume it until we are satisfied, but it doesn't stop there. For food to be of any use to anyone it must be digested.

Here at St John's, we try to help that process of digestion by the teaching provided each week in church but, more importantly I feel, we explore the contents of God's word in more depth and rather more informally in our study groups. These groups offer opportunities to discuss wider theological topics and to ask questions about those things which may be troubling you - and no question is off-limits as we seek to grow together.

So, if you are feeling hungry, or if your spiritual blood sugar level is running low why not consider joining one of our groups. This invitation is open to everyone and you do not need a theological or academic background to play a full part in our discussions ... just a willingness to be blessed.
