Pause for Thought

"An angel of the Lord appeared to Joseph in a dream. 'Get up,' he said, 'take the child and his mother and escape to Egypt. Stay there until I tell you, for Herod is going to search for the child to kill him." Matthew 2:13

Since Brexit, disputes about illegal immigration seem to have increased in intensity - one has to wonder why when the number of people entering the UK illegally is actually dwarfed by the number who have been issued visas to come to the UK legally to study, work in our health service or generally support the economy. However, putting politics and the legality of journeys to one side, one has to ask, "Why do people risk their lives, and the lives of their children, to cross the Channel in those flimsy, underpowered boats?" Surely no-one would make that journey out of choice? But the fact of the matter is that while many make the crossing with an ill-judged hope of reaching a Promised Land flowing with milk and honey, for some ... the trip is a matter of life and death.

In the UK we feel relatively safe and secure, but we have all seen or heard of conflicts and atrocities occurring in many other areas around the world. People flee from those places to escape wars, torture or even death and who can blame them.

As we criticise and grumble about those who travel to seek asylum, we tend to forget that Jesus was once a refugee. Herod wanted to get rid of him and he didn't care how many children had to suffer to achieve this evil end. He issued a decree, "All boys who were two years old or younger were to be slaughtered."

Joseph and Mary were guided by an angel to leave Isreal in order to avoid the wrath of Herod's men. However, their trip to Egypt, across the Sinai Desert, would have been just as difficult and dangerous as crossing the Channel in a small boat ... but those same dangers would have offered protection from those who hesitated to follow, and the Holy Family were able to stay in their new home until Herod had died and they could safely return to Nazareth.

As Christians we are also called to show hospitality and to share what we have. So perhaps, before we shout "Go away!", we should place ourselves in the shoes of those who are fleeing in fear for their lives and show them the kindness Jesus would have offered.


