# View from the Vicarage

I wonder what you consider to be the most momentous event in history? Maybe the first man on the moon? Or perhaps the abolition of the slave trade or the fall of the Berlin Wall? All were important events with great significance. But the events of the first Easter 2,000 years ago beat all of these hands down. A man who died a criminal's death on a cruel Roman cross rose back to life



three days later, appeared to more than 500 people over the next forty days, and then ascended into Heaven. If true, this would be a unique and unprecedented moment in

But did that first Easter really happen? I haven't space to recount all the historical, circumstantial and psychological evidence in favour of Jesus' resurrection, but to quote one former High Court judge, Charles Darling (a man used to examining evidence): "No intelligent jury in the world would fail to bring in a verdict that the resurrection story is true". And, of course, countless Christians over history can testify to a life transforming personal relationship with the risen Jesus.

But does it matter? Is the resurrection of Jesus a minor historical curiosity, of interest only to those who consider themselves 'spiritual' or 'religious'? On the contrary, the resurrection represents God's seal of approval on everything that Jesus said and did, including his call to every man, woman and child to follow him. The resurrection is also confirmation of Christ's finished work on the Cross, a powerful sign that his crucifixion secured the forgiveness of sins for all who would put their faith in him. And the events of Easter equate to a victory over death, compelling evidence of Christ's ability to grant everlasting life to anyone who trusts in him.

So, as we celebrate Easter together this month, we should remind ourselves of Christ's rightful claim to our loyalty and love. We should be reassured by the knowledge that our guilt and shame really can be removed by him. And we can look to the future with hope, knowing that Christ has conquered the grave.


