View from the Vicarage

Every Autumn, churches and communities across the country gather to celebrate Harvest - and St John's is no exception, with our own all age Harvest service on 5th October. Harvest is a time of thanksgiving for the work of farmers, for the food they grow and for God's gracious provision. Traditionally, people would bring baskets filled with fruit, vegetables, and bread to churches as a visible sign of gratitude to God, and many communities



(including ours!) still donate food to foodbanks and other charities during this season. Harvest reminds us that behind every meal lies God's generous gifts: the rain, the sun, the soil, and the unseen growth that transforms tiny seeds into abundant crops.

Harvest also points us to a deeper truth - just as God produces a physical harvest in the fields, he also wants to produce a spiritual harvest in our lives. In Galatians 5:22–23, the apostle Paul describes this as the "fruit" of the Holy Spirit, including love, joy, peace, patience, kindness, goodness, faithfulness, gentleness, and self-control. These are not virtues we can simply add to our character like items on a shopping list. They require God's Spirit to be at work within us, making us more like Jesus. And we need to ask God to produce this harvest within us. We need to invite the Holy Spirit to make us more like the kind of people we aspire to be. If do we pray for this spiritual fruit and begin to follow Christ, God promises to cultivate these character traits within us.

Harvest Festival also reminds us that fruit is meant to be shared. Just as foodbank donations are brought to bless others, so the fruit of the Spirit are for the good of the world around us. When Christians show love to the lonely, patience to the difficult, or kindness to the hurting, people catch a glimpse of Jesus and experience a taste of God's love.

So this year, as we give thanks for all our food, why not ask God to also produce a harvest within you? Because the Lord of the harvest longs to make all of us more fruitful.

Pause for Thought

"For I know the plans I have for you," declares the Lord, 'plans to prosper you and not to harm you, plans to give you hope and a future." Jeremiah 29:11

The Christian concept of hope offers a distinct approach to resilience that differs from simple positive thinking. Rather than being based on circumstances or personal outlook, Christian hope is rooted in the belief that life has an underlying purpose and direction, even when things go

This perspective significantly impacts our mental health and wellbeing. When people believe their experiences, both good and difficult, fit into a larger meaningful narrative, they tend to cope better with stress and trauma, and what makes this approach particularly valuable is its realism about suffering. Instead of denying pain or pretending everything will work out perfectly, Christian hope acknowledges that bad things happen but maintains that they don't represent the final word. This balanced view helps people process grief and disappointment without falling into despair or toxic positivity. The communal aspect of hope also matters for wellbeing because it acknowledges that people aren't expected to handle everything alone.

Additionally, Christian hope addresses guilt and shame constructively. The emphasis on forgiveness and fresh starts allows people to move forward from mistakes rather than being trapped by them. This promotes psychological healing and provides the confidence to make positive changes.

For many people today, this ancient Godly framework provides tools needed for navigating uncertainty and finding meaning in both struggle and joy, and it offers a sense of stability that doesn't depend on worldly circumstances.


