View from the Vicarage

You may have seen in the news that a NASA scientist has claimed to have identified the so-called 'Star of Bethlehem' that heralded the birth of Jesus. Mark Matney has analysed 2,000 year old astronomical records from China, and argues that a bright comet was visible from earth for over two months around the time of Jesus' infancy.

The Bible, of course, tells us of some specific astronomers who studied the stars 2000 years ago. These wise men (or 'magi') were more likely to have been Persian than Chinese, and probably educated laymen rather than royalty. But one day these men saw something in the heavens that truly caught their attention - possibly a comet or, alternatively, an exploding star (a supernova) or a conjunction of planets (such as Saturn and Jupiter). Whatever it was, the wise men believed this 'star' was a sign that a God-given king had been born, and set off to greet him. But this star alone wasn't sufficient to discover the precise coordinates of the Christ-child. Divine revelation was required to pinpoint his location. They had to consult the Old Testament book of Micah to discover that he would be born in Bethlehem.



You see, common sense can only get us so far in life. As we look ahead to the New Year and see all the opportunities and challenges in store, we need God's guidance. To live wisely in this world we need revelation as well as reason. To journey well through life we need God's words to navigate by. Church Heating — The communication issues experienced when using the church heating have now been resolved and the system is finally working as designed. However, we have to report that the boiler is very old and can be very temperamental. We are currently in discussions with the Diocesan Advisory Committee, seeking permission to replace the boiler with a new, more efficient and reliable model. Watch this space for more information when it becomes available.

Exit Light — The external light above the church's vestry door has now been fitted with a Passive Infrared Sensor which means that the light will automatically turn itself on when someone approaches after dusk and it also means that the light will stay on for a while to allow users to lock the door and descend the steps safely.

The light can still be turned on permanently using the interior switch but would users please ensure that the switch is in the "Off" position when leaving the building.

Pause for Thought

Jesus said, 'I am the light of the world. Whoever follows me will never walk in darkness, but will have the light of life.'
John 8:12

There's something quietly hopeful about this time of year. The darkest days are behind us now: each morning arrives a little earlier and the evenings seem to linger a little longer. The light is coming back but it is happening so gradually that, at first, you might miss it. However, one day you will suddenly notice the sun is still hanging in the sky when you are preparing your evening meal or you may realise the birds have returned and are beginning to sing earlier in the morning. The world in our northern hemisphere is waking up again and stretching its tendrils towards something brighter.

This slow return of light feels like a promise being kept. After months of long nights and grey afternoons, we are being reminded that darkness never gets the final word. As the earth tilts back toward the sun, life responds. Bulbs push through frozen ground; trees that looked dead begin to bud; and everything that was waiting begins to move again.

When Jesus said he was the light of the world, maybe this is part of what he meant — he is the light that calls things back to life, that won't be overcome by darkness, and continues to arrive faithfully even when we've forgotten to watch for it.

We're all a bit like those bulbs in winter. Sometimes stuck, sometimes dormant, sometimes just trying to survive until conditions improve. But light has a way of finding us anyway, and of warming us back into hope and growth.
