View from the Vicarage

This month sees the start of Lent, the forty-day run-up to Easter. The last day before Lent begins is, of course, Shrove Tuesday (17th February this year). But why 'Shrove' Tuesday? The word 'shrove' comes from the old English word 'shrive,' meaning to confess sins and receive absolution. Traditionally, Shrove Tuesday was a day when Christians examined their lives, sought forgiveness, and were reconciled with God and one another before entering Lent. In addition, foods rich in fat, sugar, eggs, and milk were eaten up before the Lenten fast – hence the tradition of eating pancakes on Shrove Tuesday. (Indeed, we will be enjoying our very own 'Pancake Party' in St. John's on the afternoon of Shrove Tuesday!)



Lent, therefore, is a season of penitence, self-examination and fasting. Jesus began his earthly ministry by fasting in the wilderness for forty days and taught his followers to fast too (Matt 6:17). Fasting for Lent might involve missing a meal, refraining from TV, chocolate or alcohol, or whatever else gets in the way of us fully focusing on God. At its best, fasting helps us remember that God alone is our deepest need - that knowing him is the essential ingredient in life and our only hope in the face of our mortality (John 17:3).

In the early Church, Lent was also a time when new Christians were instructed in the faith, in preparation for their baptism on Easter Day. Lent is therefore a good excuse to engage in Bible study. So why not dust off your Bible and begin reading it regularly this month? One of the Gospels (Matthew, Mark, Luke and John) would be an obvious place to start, and we will be working our way through John's Gospel in our church's Sunday services this Lent too. Do join us at 9am or 10.30am each week, you are very welcome!

Pause for Thought

"At once the Spirit sent him out into the wilderness, and he was in the wilderness for forty days, being tempted by Satan. He was with the wild animals, and angels attended him."

Mark 1:12-13

We all go through our desert moments, those times when life strips everything down to the bare essentials and tests what we're really made of. For Jesus, it was forty days in the actual wilderness, facing down his doubts and temptations. For me, it has happened twice: times when I have walked away from church entirely. The first time, I was distracted; the second, just disheartened. Both times I felt like I was wandering in circles with no clear direction, convinced I was better off alone. What I didn't expect was my return, not from guilt or obligation, but from something quieter: a conversation with an old friend and a moment of unexpected kindness, I had the strange sense that maybe I had not been as alone as I thought.

That's what the forty days before Easter are about for some of us. Not self-flagellation or giving up chocolate (though if that works for you, great). It's more about acknowledging that we all have our wilderness seasons. Times when we question everything, when the path forward isn't clear, when we're wrestling with our own versions of temptation, cynicism, despair, or the seductive belief that we don't need anyone.

Jesus went into the desert and came out stronger. I left twice and found my way back, not because church had all the answers, but because the desert gets lonely, and sometimes being part of something bigger than yourself is exactly what you need to give you strength.

Wherever you are right now, in or out, certain or doubting, remember, you are not walking alone.
